

Report on Prevention Programmes in Hampshire January 07 – March 07

Overview

Since April 06 the YJB funding for prevention in Hampshire has been directed towards the development of YISPs in Andover, Basingstoke, and Havant and the provision has now been up and running since June/July 06. This quarter has begun to see the impact of the Youth Arts Co-ordinator who has set up a number of arts workshops with the teams in Andover, Basingstoke and Havant. The later part of the period saw progress in combining with the Children's Fund YISP provision and extending the YISPs to the four remaining borough councils (East Hants, Eastleigh, Fareham and Winchester). The Panels are generally well supported, particularly in Andover where the Prevention Manager's involvement in the development of the Targeted Youth Support Programme has had a very positive effect in developing inter-agency working. In addition work has been undertaken to develop the links with the emerging Locality Teams. It is anticipated that the YISPs will have representation on the CAF/Locality Team Steering Groups in each borough.

- In addition to the above ONSET is being used to assess the needs of the young people.
- Parenting. The two Parenting Support Co-ordinator posts in the north of the county are currently working with over 30 parents, although the YJB returns show only 3 cases because only cases that have been closed can be counted. This return does not give a clear indication of the level of work being undertaken with parents. The first Triple P programme for the County was

delivered in Andover in March and further programmes will be offered to parents as routine.

2. Children's Fund YISPP Provision

Operational Managers were appointed to the YISP with interviews being at the end of March and both were in post by late May. Recruitment is taking place to fill the additional posts in May and June and it is anticipated that the process will have been completed by early July.
