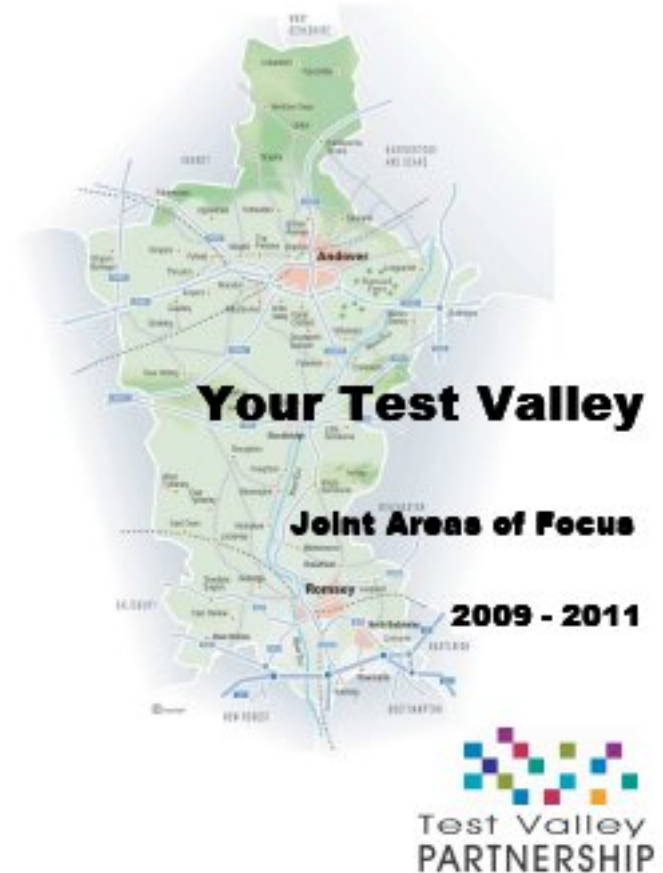

Joint Areas of Focus (JAFs)

- Launched in 2009
- Provide focus
- Identify barriers
- Make links across disciplines
- Monitor progress
- 14 JAFs in total
- JAF4 – Cohesive and Resilient Communities
- JAF8 – Major Development Areas
- Recognised as good practice by PtP



The new JAFs

- Agreed by TVP in April
- 2011-2013
- 4 JAFs in total
 - Reduce duplication
 - Greater focus
 - Reduce reporting workload

The new JAFs (cont.)

- **JAF1 – Increasing the capacity of our communities to take a lead on and resolve issues that are important to them**
- JAF2 – Tackling the root causes and effects of anti-social behaviour and alcohol misuse
- JAF3 – Tackling health inequalities in a targeted way to support independent living and active communities
- JAF4 – Sustaining the learning and skills environment within Test Valley where people can achieve their potential

The new JAFs (cont.)

- Outcome 1: Have a positive impact on individuals or communities within Test Valley
- Outcome 2: See communities taking more of a lead on tackling issues that are important to them
- Outcome 3: Be able to demonstrate that working together through the JAFs provides the most efficient and/or cost effective way in which to address the issue
