2 Minutes and matters arising from the meeting of 25th April 2007

Minutes

3 Children's Services Locality Team update – Tessa Notman-Wyatt, Locality Team Manager for Test Valley (HCC)

Packs were distributed containing further details of the new locality team and the CAF assessment framework. The team was set up 3 months ago with a preventative agenda to provide targeted youth support. The team includes 3 family support workers (2 of whom are currently being trained), 3 Education Welfare Officers and 1 inclusion worker. Provision is currently concentrated in Andover and will roll out to Romsey in September.

Frontline workers are being trained in CAF. Training dates for eligible organisations are available on the website www.hantsfish.org.uk/practitioner/caf and a password can be obtained at caf.training@hants.gov.uk to obtain a learning package.

4 Youth Inclusion and Support Panel (YISP) update – Paul Rolfe, YISP, HCC.

There are 71 at-risk 9-13 year olds on the programme, designed to reduce the likelihood of entry into the criminal justice system. In Test Valley figures for young people entering the criminal justice system have been reduced by 6% (exceeding current 5% target) and looks promising for the future. It is understood that the YISP programme is likely to have contributed to this reduction.

Progress report

- A new caseworker has been appointed bringing the number to 3.5 FTEs.
- They are extending the service to south Test Valley.
- They are delivering 3 Ps.
- Staff have undergone Open Country training to enable them to

- supervise young people undertaking outdoor activities.
- UMIS (computerised recording people) is coming online in September
- There is an extensive programme of activities for young people this summer.
- There may be a need to consider obtaining premises in Romsey. TVCS has some free office space there.

5 Partnership Performance Report - a) iQuanta (overall trends)

The partnership discussed the most recent iQuanta figures. In brief:

- Trends are showing generally stable levels with some reductions, but there is a need for further work if the partnership is to successfully meet its targets.
- The priority areas remain the same.
- Some statistics can be misleading due to very small numbers involved, and the sporadic incidences of some crimes - particularly arson.
- The Partnership continues to investigate good practice, particularly from areas like Gosport which has seen significant reductions in crime figures, but it acknowledges that the profiles of several of the boroughs are so different to that of Test Valley that innovations are not always transferable.

b) LAA performance return (FTAP and LAA measures combined)

Key features of the return include:

- The co-location of multi-agency community safety team to premises at Beech Hurst. This is currently being held up by the need to re-contract for cabling services.
- Warden accreditation is expected to be validated Hampshire Constabulary within the next 3 weeks
- There will continue to be a brief intervention programme for hazardous drinkers in spite of the withdrawal of some partners due to the budget cuts. It will not cover all of Test Valley but it will be a successful pilot project.
- Carol Rooker reported that the Home Office had indicated an intention to allocate £20k pa for 3 years to IDVA services attached to the Specialist Domestic Violence Courts. Local areas will be expected to match this funding and it is hoped that, working with Basingstoke and Deane, this will enable the recruitment of a second IDVA in North West Hampshire, so that cover can extend to include the whole of Test Valley.
- Housing associations other than Testway Housing (who are already ready
