Questionnaires Design

Our 2007 questionnaire was framed around the priorities from the Community Day to enable some statistical comparison. We designed a questionnaire (Appendix 1) which asked the residents of Alamein ward the same or similar questions to those used in 2005. We also included specific questions relating to where residents lived in the ward, for how long they had lived there and whether or not they had heard about the Turnaround project.

The Questionnaire did not specifically cover questions relating to the following Turnaround aims: Health, Resident Involvement (other than through the Questionnaire itself), and Employment.

Questionnaire Results

In November 2007, Testway sent out 3,001 questionnaires to all the residents in the Alamein Ward. We supplemented those returned direct to us by post, by door to door interviews and telephone calls. We analysed 550 completed questionnaires using SNAP software, (Appendix 2). We had 250 more responses from residents than the 300 for 2005, and a reasonable response rate of 18.3%.

Measurement of Success

The table compares the results from the Bins and Balls exercise in July 2005 with the response from 550 questionnaires in November 2007.

We used traffic lights to show whether residents have indicated a change in priority. For areas where results indicated an improvement in the area, we have shaded the table green. In areas where results indicated a decline we have shaded the table red. Where the difference (positive or negative) is less than 4% we have shaded the area amber.

From these results we can see improvements in 4 areas, and a decline in another 3. (Appendix 3)

Positive priority changes were established in the following areas:

- Football pitch
- New park and play area in King Arthurs Way
- Somewhere for the youngsters to hangout.
- Make the area feelsafer

We were also able to undertake a separate analysis for those residents who lived in King Arthurs Way. It is worth noting that less than half (41%) of the responding residents who lived in King Arthurs Way were Testway tenants.

The results show significant differences - see below.

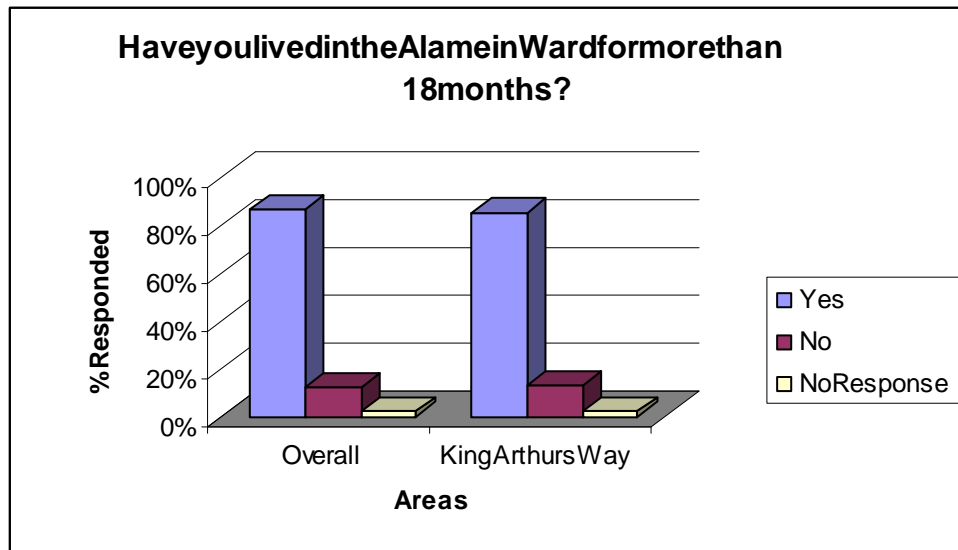

1. External Environment– Questions 3, 6, & 17

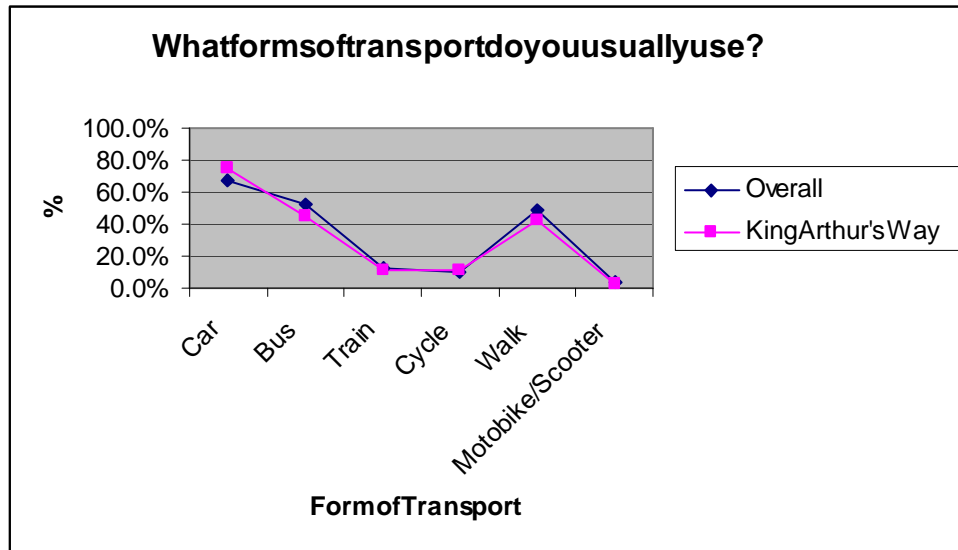

- Keep places clear of dog mess and litter Questions 3 & 6
 In 2005 53% regarded this as an issue. The problem by 2007 was more complicated. Overall there was an improvement regarding dog mess. However, 62% saw litter as a problem and 55% believed there had been no change on litter.

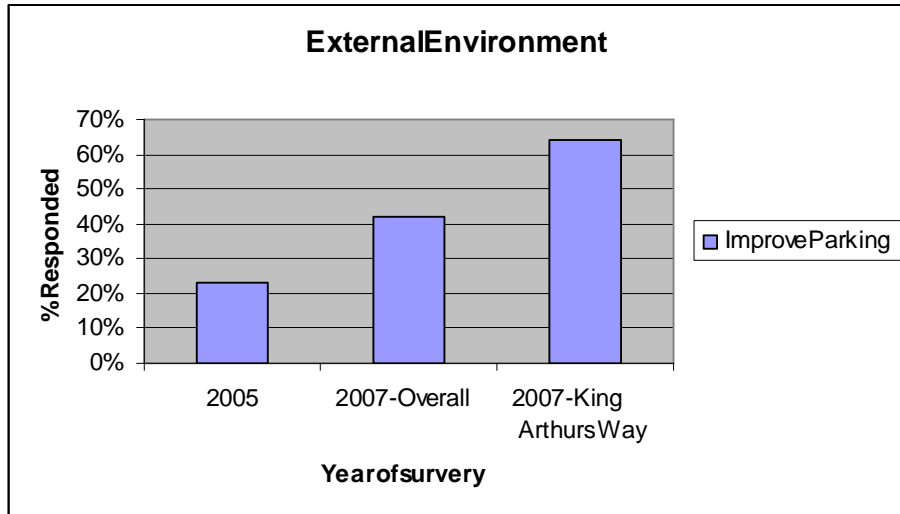
- New park and play area at King Arthur's Way Questions 3&6**
 This was an area of improvement. In 2005, 44% regarded a new park and play area as a priority. By 2007, the number had reduced to 27% and 15% of respondents overall recognised an improvement.
- The state of the lake area Questions 3&6**
 Again a small improvement in the score for 2007 - now 21% down from 24% who still saw this as a problem area.
- Improve parking Questions 3, 6 & 17**

This was a big issue in 2005, and has become worse. We asked residents what forms of transport they used. Overall 75% used a car. This was reduced to 68% for residents of King Arthur's Way, where there were more bus users and walkers.



The questionnaire put figures to the recognised parking problems of the Alamein estates. In 2005, 23% thought this a problem area. By 2007, this had increased to 42% overall and 64% for King Arthur's Way, despite the lower percentage of car users.

Turnaround Project actions ongoing include the development of a Residents' Environmental Group to remove un-roadworthy cars, restrict illegal parking, incentives to use garages, minor estate improvements, dog wagons' teeth and traffic calming.



The feedback from questions 3&6 on the frequency of bus uses showed only 14% viewing this as a problem and 19% indicating some improvement over the last 18 months.

- Improve street lighting Questions 3&6

This, like parking, showed a dramatic increase in areas where improvement was needed, doubling the original 2005 problem score from 14–28%

For the 2007 survey we added further areas to Questions 3&6. We are unable to compare the results from 2005. However, the responses do give some indication on how residents view their external environment, and whether they had recognised any improvement over the last 18 months.

- Condition of paths and paving
This was the biggest problem in this category, with over half (56%) of all respondents viewing the condition of paths & paving as a problem. Just 12% felt that there had been some improvement. The issues of multiple land ownership and responsibility may be compounding this problem, as with graffiti below.
- Graffiti
This second biggest issue was graffiti with 35% showing this as a problem and 13% recognising some improvement.
- Appearance of green areas
This showed a better result. 24% of residents viewed this as a problem and 18% felt that there had been some improvement over the last 18 months.

2. Policing and Crime Reduction Questions 3, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11,

The Turnaround project aims are:

- To generate a total package of education in the wide streets to inform residents what is and what is not acceptable behaviour and the consequences and action of failure to comply with the rules, followed by enforcement.
- Reduce the level of low-level crime and anti-social behaviour
- People to feel safe at night.

This is an important area, and is reflected in the number of questions asked, and the high response rate (up to 97%) to the question. A separate survey is also being undertaken by Hampshire Constabulary, and it will be interesting to compare results.

- Make the area feel safer Questions 3, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11
In 2005, 57% wanted the area to feel safer. Our 2007 survey shows a positive reduction in problem responses down to 15% for problems of safety in the day and 45% recorded problems of safety at night. Interestingly the majority (57%) did not feel that there had been an improvement in the last 18 months.

We recognise that there is a difference between crime statistics and fear of crime. Questions 7, 8, 9, 10, and 11 were asked to clarify some of the issues.

In 2007, 21.7% of residents acknowledged that they had been a victim of crime. This was higher for King Arthur's Way (26%). Respondents (24.5%) regarded alcohol as more of a problem than drug use (16%). The general view was that issues of alcohol and drug use had not changed over the last 18 months (Question 9).

In answer to Question 10 only 16.7% (22% for King Arthur's Way) recorded that they had been affected by drugs and alcohol problems.

Very few people answered Question 11 (14%) – they may have felt it was a repeat of Question 9 where the response rate was up to 90%. The majority answered to Question 11 indicated that the position had not changed (24.4%) or got worse (35%).

In summary, although people felt that there had been no change over the last 18 months, fewer indicated these as issues in 2007 compared to 2005.

3. Youth – Questions 3, 6, 12, 13, 14, 15

The Turnaround aim is 'for young people to make a positive contribution (or) for young people to engage in decision making and support the community and environment, to engage in law-abiding and positive behaviour in and out of school and to develop positive relationships and self-confidence to successfully deal with significant life changes and challenges.'

- Lack of Football pitch
This is an area of significant improvement. In 2005, 47% felt that the lack of a football pitch was a problem. By 2007 this had reduced to 24%.

- Somewhere for youngster to hang out Questions 3&6
This is also an area showing some improvement. In 2005, 68% found this a problem. This has been reduced to 57% 18 months later. When asked specifically, 11% felt that there had been an improvement.

Question 12 Are there any children or young people under 21 years of age in your household?

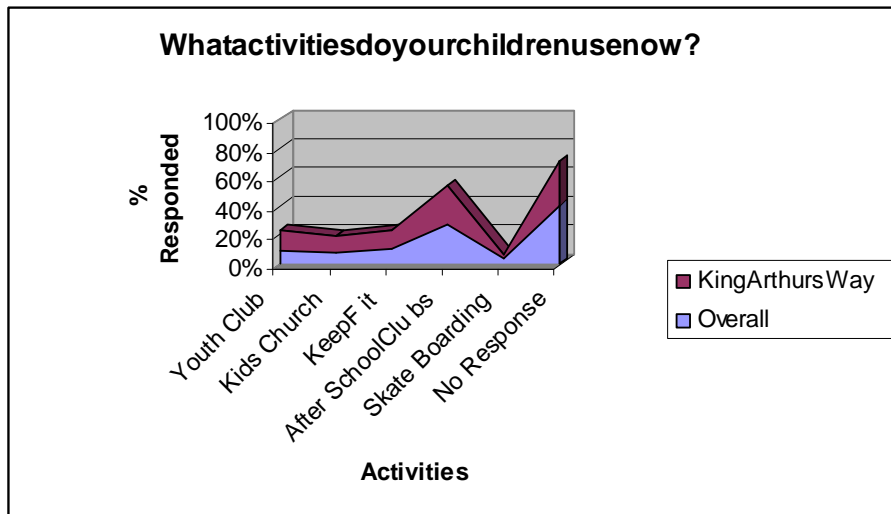
The survey showed a higher proportion of young people under the age of 21 in King Arthurs Way (38%) as against 32% for the whole of Alamein ward. Interestingly, only about a third of the households who answered question on Youth had young people in their households!

Question 13 Is there enough choice of activities for children and young people where you live?

44% recorded 'no' for Alamein Ward and 52% recorded 'no' for King Arthurs Way

Question 14 What activities do your children use now?

From respondents answers it seems that the Residents of King Arthurs Way use more local activities compared to all residents of Alamein Ward.

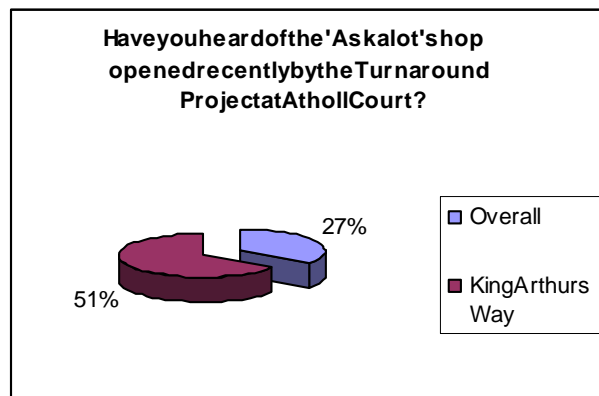

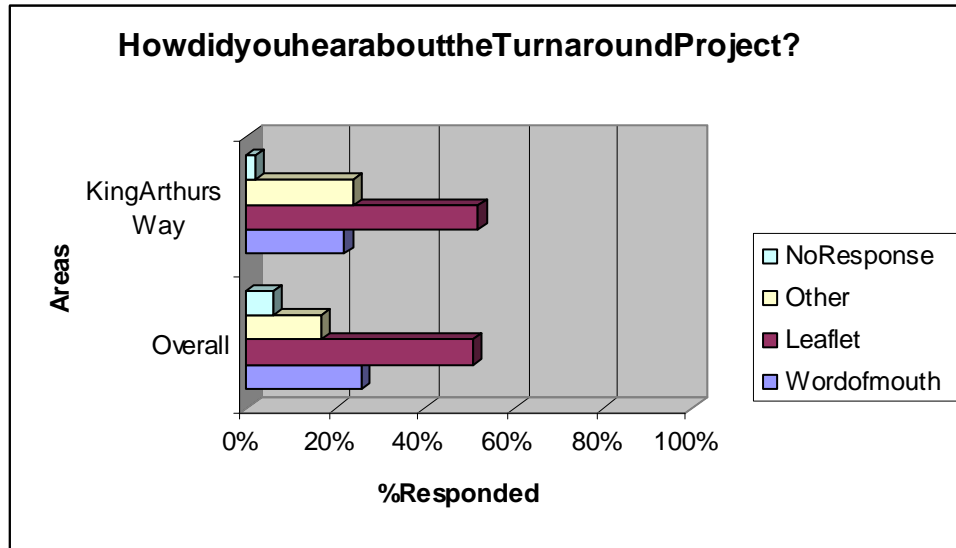

Conclusion

In conclusion, the results of the 2007 questionnaire are significant in that we had a 45% higher response than 2005, plus a wider audience.

The results show that residents responded that the biggest positive change in problems from 2005 had been in 'making the area feel safer', both at day and at night, 'football pitch' and 'park and play area'. The changes are less clear when respondents were asked where improvements had been made, though a feeling of 'safety' still comes out highest, with 'frequency of buses'.

The significant problems which remain are parking, street lighting and litter. In all these areas the problems for King Arthur's Way were higher than those for the Alamein ward as a whole. As for the issues of paths & paving, these problems may be exacerbated by multiple land ownership.
