## ITEM 6

### Introduction – Test Valley Children and Young People’s Delivery Plan

In Test Valley our vision for Children and Young People is that:

**‘We want every child and young person, including those who are vulnerable or disadvantaged, to have the best possible start in life and to develop to their full potential’.**

The Test Valley Children and Young People’s Delivery Plan details how partners will support the delivery of services to all Children and Young People aged 0-19 in Test Valley and up to the age of 25 where relevant. The Plan directly contributes to the delivery of the Hampshire Children and Young People’s Plan and it translates how the priorities at a County level should be tackled in Test Valley based on the needs of children and young people in the Borough.

The aim of this Partnership Plan is to outline:

1. the priorities for the Children & Young People’s Partnership for the year ahead
2. the aims, objectives and performance measures for each priority which the partnership will drive forward
3. where partners are delivering services for children and young people in respect to the Test Valley Partnership’s overall Joint Areas of Focus

The plan also links directly to:

- the targets and outcomes required of Children’s and Young People’s Services within Hampshire County Council and the Local Area Agreement (National Indicators and JAR recommendations and areas for improvement),
- Every Child Matters
- Aiming High for Disabled Children
- The Hampshire Primary Care Trust consultation strategy (Healthy Horizons).
- National Service Framework for Children

The Plan has been produced by the Test Valley Children & Young People’s Partnership which brings together agencies working with Children and Young People to manage and co-ordinate the delivery of this plan.

In developing the plan the Children and Young People’s Partnership has undertaken a needs assessment looking at the range of issues in Test Valley. It has also worked with Partners through the Test Valley Partnership’s eight action groups, consulted with children and young people and worked directly with stakeholders and professionals.

## ITEM 6

### Our Priorities

**In Test Valley our vision for Children and Young People is that:**

'We want every child and young person, including those who are vulnerable or disadvantaged, to have the best possible start in life and to develop to their full potential'

**We will work towards delivering the following outcomes:**

- Supporting Vulnerable Young People
- Be Healthy
- Stay Safe
- Enjoy and Achieve
- Make a Positive Contribution
- Achieve Economic Wellbeing

**To work towards achieving the outcomes, our partnership priorities for 2009/12 are:**

1. Building Emotional Resilience
2. Safeguarding Children & Young People
3. Developing Early Years Intervention strategies
4. Improving Communication with Children & Young People
5. Developing Locality Partnerships

This is a 3 year plan in which priorities will be refreshed on an annual basis to ensure Test Valley is achieving against the outcomes required through the Hampshire Children and Young People's Plan.

### Supporting the delivery of the Joint Areas of Focus

To achieve progress against the Sustainable Community Strategy, partners through the Test Valley Partnership have identified a number of "Joint Areas of Focus" (JAF). The Joint Areas of Focus are about issues currently affecting the area and are those that require a partnership approach in the short to medium term. The JAFs listed below are relevant to Children and Young People and this plan reflects how services are contributing towards them.

## ITEM 6

### Priority 1: Building Emotional Resilience

As partners and service providers we should re-shape our approach to one that is more positive in tackling issues of self esteem and self respect.

#### Key Issues:

Emotional resilience refers to the capacity of individuals to cope with stress. Resilient children have high expectations, goals, belief in their abilities, and good interpersonal problem solving skills including lower susceptibility to bullying. They have higher academic achievement and fewer emotional and behavioural problems. We need to ensure that every child in Test Valley has the opportunity to develop emotional resilience.

#### Commitment to action:

Over the next 12 months we will:

- Understand what provision is available to support children, young people and their families
- Identify models of good practice
- Put in place actions to address gaps in current provision through a range of providers both within schools and out in the community

#### Objectives for this priority:

- Undertake a strategic mapping exercise to address where intervention currently exists at a universal, targeted and specialist level.
- Visit other areas identified as having good practice examples and disseminate the information in order to build a model specific to Test Valley
- The Children and Young People's Partnership will identify sources of funding and commissioning opportunities for implementing the model.

## ITEM 6

### Priority 2: Safeguarding Children & Young People

Safeguarding children and young people is a cornerstone of the work of the partnership and one which can only successfully be achieved by working together to protect those who are at risk of neglect or injury, or those who care for them.

#### Key Issues:

Children and young people in Test Valley should be safe from maltreatment, neglect, violence or exploitation. In the wake of several high profile cases it has never been clearer that there is a real need to share information with other agencies.

#### Commitment to action:

Over the next 12 months we will:

- Host a Safeguarding conference for professionals working with children and young people across Test Valley.
- Disseminate the outcomes from the conference across the borough

#### Objectives for this priority:

- Share good practice and learn lessons for the future
- Ensure the messages reach as many as possible through a publicity campaign.

## ITEM 6

### Priority 3: Developing Early Intervention strategies

Early intervention for younger children is about moving from intervening when a crisis happens towards prevention, building resilience and providing the right level of support before more serious problems arise.

#### Key Issues:

While there are services available for older children and their families, providing help and support when problems or difficulties are identified, there is a gap in provision for younger children. We have an opportunity to work with younger children who are at risk of encountering difficulties, or who require extra support. Work at this stage has several benefits; the issue is less likely to be problematic if caught earlier, and there is a longer term saving in terms of the costs associated with later intervention and having to deal with more complex cases.

#### Commitment to action:

Over the next 12 months we will:

- Support the completion of the Alamein Children's Centre by summer 09
- Identify what can be reasonably provided through a 1 stop shop approach to early years intervention
- Prepare and train all agencies to use the Common Assessment Framework (CAF), and promote the lead professional role in co-ordinating services for individual children & families
- Plan on a multi-agency basis the development of services around the new build of Knights Enham Schools
- Explore and plan to implement a system to prevent unnecessary referral of families by joining up with referral meetings with under 5 services

#### Objectives for this priority:

- Research to establish and define need
- Work with primary schools to find the key elements of support that are required

## ITEM 6

### Priority 4: Improving Communication with Children & Young People

Young people often comment that they do not know what activities and services are available to them. Research suggests that information is readily available, but it is not communicated as effectively as it could be.

#### Key Issues:

Information on services, activities and support for young people is widely available across Test Valley, but we need to gather the information into one place, be more effective in how we disseminate that information.

#### Commitment to action:

In the next 12 months we will:

- Build a comprehensive picture and develop greater understanding of the processes we already have in place to communicate with Children and Young People in Test Valley.
- Explore a range of tools that can be used to target young people more effectively such as Hants Fish and Facebook.
- Deliver a project focused towards those children and young people who are identified as vulnerable to engage them in how services can better inform, involve and consult with them.

#### Objectives for this priority:

- Collect all the information in one place so it can be easily found
- Promote the resource to young people by using targeted media.
- Work with young people in designing and developing new methods for communicating information.

## ITEM 6

### Priority 5: Developing Locality Partnerships

#### Key Issues:

Hampshire Children's Trust (formally the CYPP board) has set out an expectation for the setting up of Locality partnerships; it has been proposed they be based on the geography of the extended services partnerships. These Locality partnerships would ensure the CYPP plan is delivered at a local level with a partnership which can respond to local need. Test Valley would have minimum of two Locality partnerships one for the north and one for the south.

#### Commitment to action:

In the next 12 months we will:

- Establish 2 locality Partnerships in Test Valley
- Re-model the Borough wide Children and Young People's Partnership to reflect the locality partnerships ensuring a strategic fit with the Test Valley Partnership and the Hampshire wide Children's Trust.
- Co-ordinate commissioning of services and distribution of local grants for Children and Young People's services in Test Valley through the Funding sub Group

Obesity levels are rising and Test Valley along with 8 other districts in Hampshire has a projected higher than average prevalence of obesity than the national average. Obesity tends to be more common in areas of relative deprivation and children and young people are a key group affected by this issue.
